- An individual whose usual place of abode is outside the United Kingdom (UK) can use this form to apply to have his or her UK rental income paid without the deduction of UK tax. **Approval of the application does not make the rent exempt from UK tax.** The individual must include the rent in any Self Assessment Tax Return HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) sends.
- Use this form only if you are an individual. A company should use form NRL2, and a trustee should use form NRL3.
- Use the *Guidance Notes for form NRL1* to help you complete this form. If you need more space write your answers to the questions on another sheet of paper and attach it to this form.
